Grades 5/6 Interschool Sports 2019

In 2019 as part of the Mooroolbark District Primary School Sports Association, we will be playing Interschool Sport against Billanook and Oxley Colleges and Lilydale West, Manchester, Lilydale, Gladesville and Kilsyth Primary Schools. Depending on the sport your child competes in, they may play at a secondary college or local sports field, close to the opposition school, as is indicated in the fixture below.

Interschool Sport will be held between 9am and 11am on Fridays, beginning on Friday 8th February 2019, for Terms 1 and 2. It is imperative that students arrive at school on time. Buses for away games leave CPPS at 9:05am, to return by 11am.

There are 5 different sports for students to select from in Summer Competition (Term 1). Basketball Girls, Basketball Open, Cricket T20, Tennis, Tee-Ball and Tag Rugby.

In Winter Competition (Term 2) the sports will be: AFL, Soccer, Volleyball, Netball Open, Netball Girls and Softball.

The cost of the Interschool Sports Program for 2019 will be \$40.00 per competing student. Payment is to cover the cost of transport to other schools. As stated in our recently published policy all students are expected to travel by bus to the designated venue. As you would appreciate the administration of monies and student details regarding excursions and incursions is a time consuming process and it needs to be completed well before the date of the event. To alleviate teacher and office staff stress we are strictly enforcing our policy that all permission slips and payments must be in at least 2 days prior to the excursion/incursion. From now on **no late payments/permission slips will be accepted.** If you are experiencing financial hardship there is always the opportunity to speak to Mrs Marinakos and arrange a payment plan but this must be done well before the due date.

Please return permission slip and payment by Monday 4th Feb 2019.

Students will be required to wear the Chirnside Park Sports Shirt with navy blue shorts, tracksuit pants or netball skirt (Term 2). If playing basketball in Term 1 or football in Term 2 a singlet/jersey will be provided for the term. It is compulsory for students to supply a mouth-guard to play football. If students do not have the required uniform they will be unable to attend Interschool Sports. Students may be required to play in wet and muddy conditions. It is imperative they **bring a change of clothes and a towel each week** so they can change once they return to school and do not have to spend the day in wet clothing. **If your child suffers from asthma, please make sure they bring and carry their puffers with them.**

****** Urgent Help Needed: We are looking for parent helpers to come along to interschool sport each week. We will have three 5/6 teachers coming along however there will be some sports that will require parent helpers to manage/supervise a sport/team and possibly umpire the students. If you would be available on Friday mornings each week to help please indicate on the attached reply slip.***

All students and parents/guardians must read and adhere to the players and spectators codes of behavior, attached.

Please refer to the School Sport Victoria code of behaviour, outlined for players and spectators (*overleaf*). Chirnside Park Primary School operates very strictly under these codes when participating in all sporting events/competitions. It would be a great idea for you to read through these with your child. Any child who fails to comply with the code of behaviour, or if the staff have reason to feel concerned that a child may not be able to comply with the code of behaviour, their participation may be restricted.

PLAYERS' CODE OF BEHAVIOUR

- (a) Play for the "fun of it" and not just to please parents and coaches.
- (b) Play by the rules.
- (c) Never argue with an official. If you disagree, have your captain or coach approach the official during a break or after the game.
- (d) Control your temper. Verbal abuse of officials or other players, deliberately fouling or provoking an opponent and throwing equipment is not acceptable or permitted in any sport.
- (e) Work equally hard for yourself and your team. Your team's performance will benefit, so will you.
- (f) Treat all players as you would like to be treated. Do not interfere with, bully, or take unfair advantage of another player.
- (g) Co-operate with your coach, team-mates and opponents. Without them there would be no game.

SPECTATORS' CODE OF BEHAVIOUR

- (a) Students play organised sport for fun. They are not playing for the entertainment of spectators only, nor are they miniature professionals.
- (b) Applaud good performance and efforts by your team AND the opponents. Congratulate both teams upon their performance regardless of the game's outcome.
- (c) Respect the officials decision. If there is a disagreement, follow the appropriate procedure in order to question the decision and teach the children to do likewise.
- (d) Never ridicule a player for making a mistake during a competition. Positive comments are motivating.
- (e) Condemn the use of violence in any form, be it by spectators, coaches, officials or players.
- (f) Show respect for your team's opponents. Without them there would be no game.
- (g) Encourage players to play according to the rules and the officials' decisions.
- (h) Demonstrate appropriate social behaviour by not using foul language, harassing players, coaches or officials.
